A Brief Synopsis of Every Nominated Film

Ad Astra: Astronaut Roy McBride embarks on a mission across the solar system to uncover the truth about his missing father and his doomed space expedition that now, 30 years later, threatens the universe.

American Factory: In post-industrial Ohio, a Chinese billionaire opens a new factory in the husk of an abandoned GM plant and hires 2,000 blue-collar Americans. Early days of hope and optimism give way to setbacks as high-tech China clashes with working-class America.

Avengers: Endgame: With half the world's population wiped out and their own ranks fractured, the remaining Avengers grapple with psychological scars while trying to find the will to assemble once again and restore order and harmony in the universe.

A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood: After he is assigned to profile children's TV host Fred Rogers, a jaded magazine writer overcomes his skepticism to learn about kindness, love, and forgiveness from America's most beloved neighbor.

Bombshell: Three women take on the controversial media empire Fox News and face off against the powerful man who created it.

Breakthrough: In St. Louis, a teen falls into a frozen lake and is pulled out by a fireman after a life-threatening 15 minutes. When attempts at resuscitation fail, the family inspires the town through faith to bring the boy back to life.

Brotherhood: Mohamed is deeply shaken and suspicious when his estranged eldest son Malek returns home to rural Tunisia with a mysterious young wife in tow. The emotional complexities of a family reunion and past wounds lead to tragic consequences.

The Cave: In war-torn Syria, a dedicated team of female doctors tirelessly treat casualties in an underground hospital while battling systemic sexism.

Corpus Christi: After leaving the violent Youth Detention Center, 20-year-old Daniel decides to pose as a parish priest, despite his lack of religious education. His spirit and passion inspire his small-town congregants, who have been unable to heal after the tragic accidental death of seven of their youth.

Dcera (Daughter): In a hospital room, the Daughter recalls a difficult childhood moment when as a little girl she tried to share her experience with an injured bird with her Father.

The Edge of Democracy: A cautionary tale about one of the most dramatic periods in Brazilian history and the polarizing rise and fall of the country's leaders.

Ford v Ferrari: Visionary auto designer Carroll Shelby and race car driver Ken Miles team up to build a high-performance race car for the Ford Motor Company, hoping to defy the odds and defeat the dominant Ferrari at the 1966 Le Mans.

For Sama: During the five years of the uprising in Aleppo, Syria, Waad al-Kateab falls in love, gets married and gives birth to Sama.

Frozen II: Troubled by a growing imbalance in her kingdom's forests, Elsa, together with Anna, Kristoff, Olaf and Sven, ventures into the unknown on a dangerous but remarkable journey. Having once feared her powers were too much for the world, Elsa now must hope they are enough.

Hair Love: An African-American father learns to do his daughter's hair for the first time.

Harriet: Slave Harriet Tubman escapes from a Maryland plantation and transforms into one of America's most renowned freedom fighters, using her courage and tenacity to lead hundreds of slaves north on the Underground Railroad.

Honeyland: Hatidze lives with her ailing mother in the mountains of Macedonia, making a living cultivating honey using ancient beekeeping traditions. When an unruly family moves in next door, what at first seems like a balm for her solitude becomes a source of tension as they, too, want to practice beekeeping.

How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World: Hiccup and Toothless have settled into their lives as leaders of a chaotic dragon utopia, but when the fearsome Night Fury dragon suddenly appears and their village is threatened, the two must journey into the unknown to save their world.

I Lost My Body: Adventure, young love and childhood memories intertwine as a severed hand crosses Paris in search of its owner.

In the Absence: When the MV Sewol ferry sank off the coast of South Korea in 2014, over three hundred people lost their lives, most of them schoolchildren. Years later, the victims' families and survivors are still demanding justice from national authorities.

The Irishman: As an old man, World War II vet Frank Sheeran reflects on his life as a hustler and mob hitman, working alongside many notorious figures, including Jimmy Hoffa, the subject of one of the greatest unsolved mysteries in American history.

Jojo Rabbit: During World War II, a lonely German boy's world is turned upside down when he discovers his single mother is hiding a young Jewish girl in their attic. Aided only by his idiosyncratic imaginary friend Adolf Hitler, Jojo must confront his blind nationalism.

Joker: In Gotham's fractured society, a young man longs to be a stand-up comic, but finds the joke is always on him. Caught in a cycle of apathy, cruelty and ultimately, betrayal, the comedian makes one bad decision after another, bringing about a chain reaction of escalating events.

Judy: Thirty years after she shot to stardom, showbiz legend Judy Garland arrives in London to perform a five-week sold-out run of shows. As she prepares her act, fights with management, charms musicians and reminisces with friends and fans, her wit and warmth shine through.

Kitbull: A fiercely independent stray kitten and a chained-up pit bull experience friendship for the first time.

Klaus: When a selfish young postman is assigned to a remote Scandinavian town, his unlikely friendship with a reclusive toymaker leads to the creation of Santa Claus.

Knives Out: When a popular mystery writer turns up dead in his mansion, renowned private detective Benoit Blanc investigates, revealing that every member of the eccentric author's family, as well as his nurse, is a murder suspect.

Learning to Skateboard in a Warzone (if You're a Girl): Over the course of 15 years, a class of young girls from disadvantaged neighborhoods in war-torn Kabul, learn to read and write, and grow together in confidence through the joy of skateboarding.

Les Misérables: Stéphane has recently joined the Anti-Crime Brigade in Montfermeil, the town where Victor Hugo set his novel "Les Misérables." He quickly discovers tensions running high between neighborhood gangs. When his team finds itself overrun during the course of an arrest, a drone captures their every action.

Life Overtakes Me: Hundreds of refugee children in Sweden who have fled with their families from extreme trauma in their home countries have become afflicted with Resignation Syndrome. Facing deportation, they withdraw from the world into a coma-like state, as if frozen, for months or even years.

The Lighthouse: Two troubled lighthouse keepers confront epic storms and personal demons on a remote and mysterious New England island in the 1890s.

The Lion King: In Africa, future king Simba is born, but the ensuing battle for Pride Rock is marred by betrayal and tragedy, resulting in the young cub's exile. With help from a curious pair of newfound friends, Simba soon finds he must grow up and take back what is rightfully his.

Little Women: In the late 1860s, burgeoning author Jo March looks back on her and her three sisters' Massachusetts childhoods and the events and relationships that helped shape them as adults.

Maleficent: Mistress of Evil: Maleficent and goddaughter Aurora begin to question the complex family ties that bind them as they are pulled in different directions by impending nuptials, unexpected allies and dark new forces.

Marriage Story: A young creative couple and their son navigate the tricky waters of bicoastal separation and impending divorce.

Memorable: Painter Louie and his wife Michelle are experiencing strange events. Their world seems to be mutating. Slowly, furniture, objects, and people lose their realism. They are "de-structuring," sometimes disintegrating.

Missing Link: Mr. Link, aka Bigfoot, is lonely and believes that famed investigator of myths Sir Lionel Frost is the one man who can help him. Along with adventurer Adelina Fortnight, Mr. Link and Frost embark on an epic journey to find Mr. Link's distant relatives, and their own true identities, in the fabled Shangri-La.

Nefta Football Club: In south Tunisia, two football fan brothers bump into a headphones-wearing donkey in the desert on the border of Algeria. Unaware that two men are waiting for the donkey and its hidden drug stash, the brothers take the animal back home with them.

The Neighbors' Window: The life of a middle-aged woman with small children is shaken up when two free-spirited twenty-somethings move in across the street.

1917: During World War I, two British soldiers are sent on a dangerous mission to stop an attack by the British 7th Division that will result in a massacre by the Germans. Their assignment takes on extra urgency as one of the young soldiers' brothers is fighting in that Division.

Once Upon a Time...In Hollywood: In Los Angeles in 1969, aging TV star Rick Dalton and his longtime stunt double Cliff Booth struggle to make their way around an industry and a city they hardly recognize anymore.

Pain and Glory: Salvador Mallo, a renowned film director in physical decline, revisits his past: his childhood with his mother, his first desire, his first adult love and breakup, and the early discovery of cinema.

Parasite: Greed, class discrimination and a mysterious interloper threaten the newly formed symbiotic relationship between the wealthy Park family and the destitute Kim clan.

Richard Jewell: During the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, security guard Richard Jewell alerts authorities to an incendiary device in Centennial Park and is hailed as a life-saving hero. But within days, Jewell becomes the FBI's number one suspect, and his reputation and life are ripped apart.

Rocketman: Shy piano prodigy Reginald Dwight embarks on a career in music, transforming into international superstar Elton John, an iconic figure in pop culture.

Saria: Inseparable orphaned sisters Saria and Ximena are fighting against daily abuse and unimaginable hardship at the Virgen de La Asuncion Safe Home in Guatemala when a tragic fire claims the lives of 41 orphaned girls.

A Sister: An emergency services dispatcher must tap into all her professional skills when she receives a call from a woman in a desperate situation.

Sister: A man remembers his childhood and growing up with an annoying little sister in 1990s China. How would his life have been if things had gone differently?

Star Wars: The Rise of Skywalker: With the help of new and unexpected allies, the Resistance must find the will and the way to defeat the First Order in a final battle for freedom.

St. Louis Superman: Bruce Franks Jr., a leading Ferguson activist and battle rapper who was elected to the overwhelmingly white and Republican Missouri House of Representatives, must overcome both personal trauma and political obstacles to pass a bill critical to his community.

Toy Story 4: Woody and the gang go on a road trip with new toy Forky, who's convinced he's trash and doesn't yet understand his role in the world. Along the way, Woody is unexpectedly reunited with independent spirit Bo Peep and finds himself faced with a decision, and a future, he never imagined.

The Two Popes: In 2012, the introspective Pope Benedict and his harshest critic, Cardinal Bergoglio, engage in a deep, revelatory discussion about the state of the Catholic Church and their future as its leaders.

Walk Run Cha-Cha: Chipaul and Millie Cao reunited in 1980s Los Angeles after being separated by the Vietnam War. Forty years later, they become ballroom dancers to reconnect again and make up for lost time.
